

McDuffie Museum 2026 Echoes of Independence Literary Competition

Celebrating the 250th Birthday of the United States

Calling all area young writers! The McDuffie Museum invites local students to participate in a writing contest inspired by one of the museum pieces honoring the Semiquincentennial marking 250 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776.

Who Can Enter?

Students in the following grade groups:

- **Grades 4–6**
- **Grades 7–9**
- **Grades 10–12**

One winner will be selected from each age level group, and one Grand Champion Winner will be chosen from among them. Winners will be notified by Wednesday, May 20 by the phone or email provided.

Writing Guidelines

- **Format:** Poem or short story neatly written or typed (double spaced, 12 point font). Do not include your name or other identifying information on the entry.
- **Length:** Up to 1,000 words
- **Theme:** Inspired by one or more museum pieces on display related to the U.S. 250th or the United States' Semiquincentennial.
- **Original Work Only**
 - Submissions must be the student's own work.
 - Use of A.I. tools is not allowed.
- **Sources:** Must be listed if outside references are used.

- **Judging:** Creativity (40%); Connection to Theme or Inspired Piece (30%) and Mechanics (30%)

Important Note

- *Parent or guardian permission is required.*

Submission Deadline

All entries must be submitted by Friday, May 1, 2026.
